STUDY OBJECTIVE:

To characterize social language profiles and related cognitive and mechanistic skills in autistic females and their family members

IMPORTANCE OF STUDY:

- Explores heritable behavioral and cognitive traits that may relate to differences in the expression of autistic traits in females, who have been historically underrepresented in research
- Helps inform the lived experiences of autistic females

WE ARE LOOKING FOR:

- Autistic adolescents and adults and their parents
- Adolescents and adults without autism and their parents

PARTICIPATION INCLUDES:

- Completing questionnaires
- Telling stories
- Solving puzzles
- Talking about your friendships and the ways you relate to other people

COMPENSATION AND TIME:

- Participation involves 1-2 visits
- Compensation for participation varies with the number of tasks completed
